The monument signifies the "First Pinchot Road" and is in very poor condition. On July 23, 1931, Governor Gifford Pinchot broke ground at this location to inaugurate the rural road improvement program for the Pennsylvania Department of Highways under the Township State Highway

Law of June 22, 1931. This year will be the 75th anniversary of this program and our hope is to have the monument restored and have a re-dedication ceremony on July 23rd. Thank you to Ray Britcher for bringing this to our attention. Second, we have recently met with Steve Roman who is working with the Engineers Week Council on their Educational Outreach Committee (EOC). This program has reached out to thousands of local area students of all ages through several different mediums. The ASHE Board would like to get our section more involved with this program. 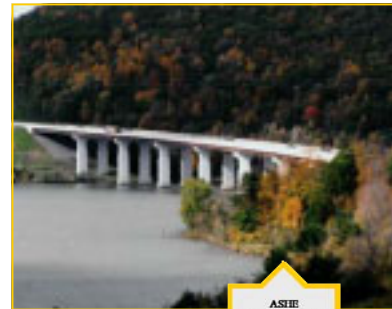
Annual Photo Contest Winners Announced

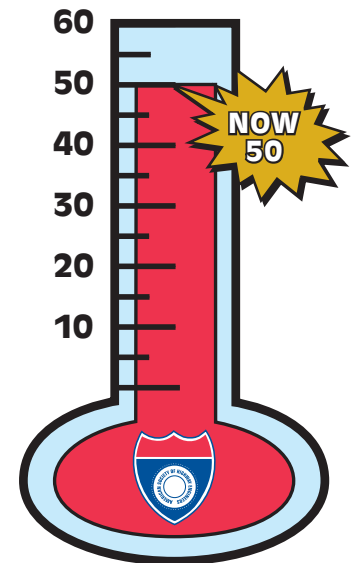
