Business Strategies for District 8-0

Scott Christie is currently the Acting District Executive for PennDOT District 8-0. As District Executive, Scott is responsible for Design, Construction, Operations, and Maintenance of all state owned roads and bridges in the eight counties that make up District 8-0. Previously, Scott was the Director of the Bureau of Design for PennDOT. The Bureau of Design is involved in the entire design process by providing surveying and mapping, acquiring consultant services, setting standards, reviewing highway and bridge projects, managing right-of-way acquisition, managing utilities for transportation projects, providing transportation projects for construction contractors to bid on, awarding construction contracts, and providing information technology to support and automate PennDOT's design functions. Previously, Scott held the positions of Chief Bridge Engineer and Assistant Chief Bridge Engineer for the Department. He also served on the AASHTO Bridge Subcommittee and various AASHTO Technical Committees (Steel, Concrete, Culverts, and Computers) as well as many NCHRP Project Panels.

Prior to working for the Department Scott was a design engineer with Modjeski and Masters. As a designer Scott worked on a variety of structure types including Cable Stayed, Suspension, Curved, Prestressed, Segmental, Truss, Girder and Buried structures. During his career at the Department, Scott helped write the Design Manual for structures and managed the effort to introduce LRFD to Pennsylvania.

Scott obtained his Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Pennsylvania and his Master of Engineering Degree from Cornell University.

INTRODUCTION

By submitting a photograph for this contest, you are granting permission for the ASHE Harrisburg Section to use, duplicate, and distribute a copy of this photograph in any form (electronic or otherwise) as deemed appropriate.
- Roadways, bridges and tunnels are considered parts of highways. We encourage contestants to submit photos of interesting highway features from sites in Pennsylvania, although entries from anywhere in the world are welcome, extra points will be given to photos from Pennsylvania.

JUDGING

- Entries will be judged at the February 4, 2008 dinner meeting. First, second, and third place awards will be given. The winning entries will be displayed at the American Society of Highway Engineers mall display during Engineers Week. Awards will be presented to the winners at our dinner meeting on April 7, 2008.

RULES

- All entries should be post-marked by January 21, 2008 and must be received by no later than January 28, 2008 to be eligible for judging.
- Each contestant may submit only **ONE** (1) photograph, which must have been taken by the contestant. All entries must be 8" X 10" prints. Original slides or negatives will not be accepted. Black and white or color photographs are acceptable in this competition. The contestant's name, address, daytime telephone number and photograph title must be written clearly in ink on the back of the photograph.
- All entries must be accompanied with a brief title (7 words or less) and description (50 words or less) of the highway, bridge or tunnel in the photograph; this description must include the name and location of the highway facility and a brief explanation of any construction or maintenance activity. This write-up must also be e-mailed to the address listed below.

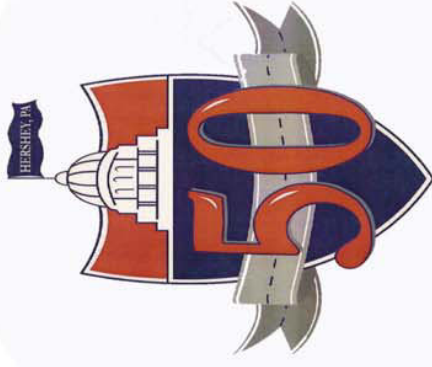

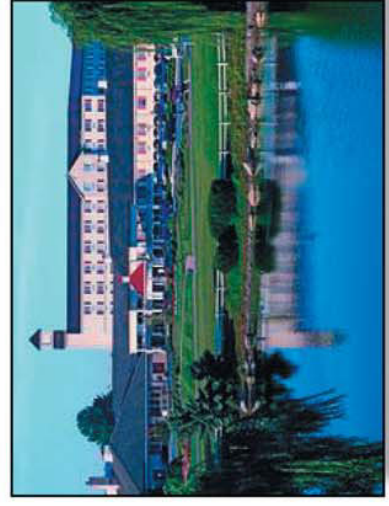

TECHNICAL PROGRAM

50 years of the American Highway System

Transportation: Legislatively Speaking
The discussion topic will be 50 years of transportation legislation and funding reforms. The purpose of the session is to demonstrate how the legislative funding mechanisms have changed over the years and discuss what challenges the future holds for funding sources.

Highway Driven/Industry Driven
A historical perspective of the highway industry will be presented, initially focusing on industries such as coal, steel and concrete. The discussion will begin with the influence that the industry had on the development of roads and will continue to show how the perspective has changed, such that roadway development influences industrial development. Discussions will also include aesthetic and design considerations, as well as the trucking and railroad industry and their impact on the roadway system.

Technical Project and Tour

A technical presentation and tour of a major roadway construction project will also be offered. The project fits into the theme of the history of the roadway system - the purpose of the project is to widen and rehabilitate a major travel way in the area as a result of increased traffic volumes and economic development.
