## Speaker and Program

### Joseph G. Brimmeier

#### CEO, Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission

Joe was born and raised in Pittsburgh, Pa., and graduated from North Catholic High School. After high-school graduation, he earned Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Youngstown State University, Ohio.

Joe has more than 30 years of government experience at the local, state and federal levels. He has held numerous positions with Allegheny County, and he also served as the Municipal Manager of Monroeville, Pa.

On the state and federal levels, Joe was Deputy Auditor General for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and Chief of Staff for U.S. Congressman Ron Klink.

On Feb. 4, 2003, Gov. Ed Rendell appointed Joe as Chief Executive Officer of the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission.

In his first two years at the Turnpike, Joe successfully implemented a toll increase (the first one since 1991), navigated through a Teamster's Union strike (the first in the Turnpike's history), and launched an ambitious program to totally rebuild "America's First Superhighway" from the ground up.

Joe has also leveraged technology to bring safety and customer-service improvements to the Turnpike. His priorities thus far have been enhancing and expanding the E-ZPass program, broadening the Turnpike's Advanced Traveler Information Systems (ATIS), and spearheading a unique fog-detection and alert system in a high-elevation stretch of the western Turnpike.

Joe was a member of the Eastern Association of Intercollegiate Football Officials for 20 years; he is married and has two adult children.

He directed a growing society's need toward technical advancements, invention, and education.

The Central Pennsylvania Engineers Week Council (CPEWC) will be leading the week long celebration in the greater Harrisburg area from February 20 to 24 with many events and activities throughout the Greater Harrisburg Area. One of the biggest events is our annual display in the Colonial Park Mall and our annual Banquet in recognition of local engineers, to be held February 23, 2006 at the West Shore Country Club.

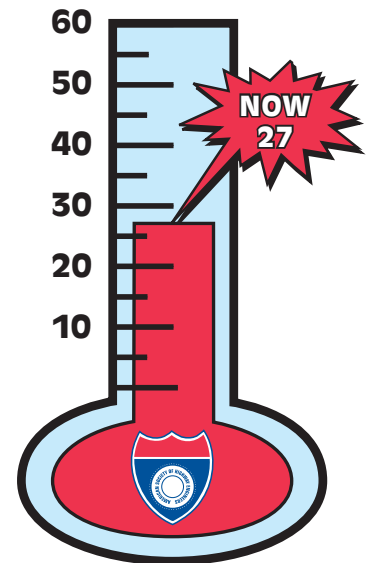

Chocolate is not just the brown stuff that tastes good; it is the end product of a complex manufacturing process, in which small variations (both deliberate and occasionally accidental) can have major impact on the acceptability of the finished product. You will hear about how chocolate is made, especially addressing all the many engineering disciplines that are involved in the process. This will include some brief history of chocolate, starting with the cocoa bean and the various forms in which it has been consumed over the centuries. The presentation will concentrate, though, on the modern manufacturing processes, with the various sequential unit operations involved. All of these have their counterparts in other industries, but using them in the relatively sensitive process of chocolate making can put some significant constraints on their operation -- relatively small process variations can significantly change the flavor of the finished chocolate.
