1. Continue Southwest on Eisenhower Boulevard toward 2nd Street/PA-230 for approximately 0.2 miles.
2. At signalized T intersection with 2nd Street/PA-230 turn right
3. Continue on 2nd Street/PA-230 for approximately 0.2 miles to 2715C Front Street. (2nd Street becomes Front Street once you enter Steelton Borough)
4. Turn right into construction site at 2715C Front Street, Steelton, PA.

Restoration of last covered bridge in Dauphin County wins National Timber Bridge Award of Merit

Herbert, Rowland & Grubic, Inc. (HRG) is pleased to announce that Dauphin County's Henninger Farm Bridge was selected for a National Timber Bridge Award of Merit in the Rehabilitated Bridges category. Out of hundreds of entries, this is one of only 50 bridges across the United States to receive a National Timber Bridge Award since the program began 10 years ago. Company president Robert Grubic, P.E., presented a plaque commemorating the award to the Dauphin County Commissioners at their regularly scheduled meeting on May 10.

Because it was the last remaining covered bridge in Dauphin County, local officials were deeply committed to restoring the structure after it was destroyed by arson in 2001. "I have always maintained that the Henninger Farm Bridge is one of Dauphin County's greatest treasures and best-kept secrets," said County Commissioner Jeff Haste. "This prestigious award verifies this bridge's status as one of the biggest architectural and historical masterpieces in the state. I warmly congratulate HRG and the many other generous, caring people who have made this possible."

HRG served as engineer for the rehabilitation of this structure, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is located in Washington Township, Dauphin County. Due to fire damage, all of the timber had to be replaced, but HRG carefully studied the original circa 1880 designed structure to replicate it as closely as possible using new material in order to preserve the historic integrity of this landmark structure.

The National Timber Bridge Awards are selected based on criteria such as innovative design, aesthetics, cost effectiveness, and utilization of wood products to help solve bridge problems. Sponsors of the award include the American Institute of Timber Construction, APA - The Engineered Wood Association, and the U.S. Forest Service-Wood in Transportation Program.

In Memoriam

Ret. Col. Richard H. Harris, Jr., 60, of Camp Hill, died peacefully at home on Saturday, February 4, 2006.

He was the son of Mary Harris and the late Richard Harris, Sr. Richard is survived by his loving wife of 39 years, Patricia. In addition to his wife, he is survived by two sons, Mark and Christopher.

He was born on June 18, 1945 in Atlantic City, N.J. He graduated from Franklin and Marshall College in 1967 with a degree in anthology. He later graduated from the University of Tennessee in 1972 with an MBA. Rich was a retired Colonel in the United States Air Force. He served in the Vietnam Conflict and was awarded the Bronze Star. Upon leaving active service, he then served on the Air Staff of the United States Air Force. He was the Directorate of Transportation and later on the Joint Staff of the United States Directorate of Logistics. He also served on active duty during Desert Storm/ Desert Shield, where he was awarded the Defense Superior Service Medal.

Rich joined PennDOT as an Assistant County Maintenance Manager. He later accepted a position with the Bureau of Personnel's Training Division. As a result of his success he was appointed to lead the newly formed Productivity Center. He ultimately became the Director of the Center for Performance Excellence. He played a vital role in transforming the department into an agency nationally recognized for its excellence in delivering transportation services. He was known at PennDOT as "Mr. Quality".

He was a member of the American Association of Highway Transportation Officials and Transportation Research Board committee's. Locally he served as a past officer and board member of the Association for Quality and Participation and was a member of the American Society of Highway Engineers since 1980. Leading by example, he was among the first cadre of Department managers to test for and achieve designation as a Certified Quality Manager by the American Society for Quality.

Robert D. Hutton died May 15, 2006 at Cumberland Crossings, Carlisle, PA.

He was born November 28, 1916 in Memphis, Tennessee. Bob graduated from the Pennsylvania State College (now Penn State University) in the 1937 civil engineering class and was engaged in civil engineering all his life.

In 1943 he joined the Seabee branch of the Civil Engineering Corps, U.S. Naval Reserve. After service in the Pacific including Hawaii and Okinawa, he joined Modjeski and Masters Consulting Engineers of Harrisburg, PA.

As a partner with Modjeski and Masters he played a major role in designing many important railroad and highway bridges over the Susquehanna, Ohio, Calumet, St. Lawrence, Hudson, Mississippi, Potomac and Schuylkill rivers; over Fire Island Inlet on Long Island; and over the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal. He was active in bridge inspections and investigations including the Silver Bridge catastrophe over the Ohio River, the Yadkin River collapse in Siloam, NC, and the Canadian River collapse in Calvin, OK.

Bob was a member of the Engineers Society of Pennsylvania, the American Society of Civil Engineers (of which he was a Fellow), the National Society of Professional Engineers, the American Railway Engineering Association, and the Mason Dixon Line Preservation Partnership. He was also a life member of the American Society of Highway Engineers, joining in 1969. He served as an officer in many of these professional organizations. He played a key role in Modjeski and Masters' transformation into a true partnership, which expanded the company's horizons immensely. He assisted in the design of many large highway interchanges such as those on I-95 in Philadelphia and the Harrisburg Bypass, and bridges over the Susquehanna River at Harrisburg. He withdrew from the Modjeski and Masters partnership in 1976 and retired in 1980.

He is survived by three children, Jane M. Hutton of Lancaster, PA; Robert D. Hutton, Jr. of Hoonah, AK, and William R. Hutton of Sitka, AK; and four grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his wife, Dorothy Martsolf Hutton and by his brothers, Sidney B. ("Beany") Hutton and Richard J. Hutton.
