Michael M. Ryan, P.E.
Deputy Secretary for Highway Administration
Pennsylvania Department of Transportation

As Deputy Secretary for Highway Administration of the fourth-largest state highway system in the nation, Michael M. Ryan is responsible for the Department's design, construction and maintenance programs. The annual program amounts to \$2.6 billion; \$1.55 billion for new construction starts and \$1.1 billion for operations and maintenance for over 40,000 miles of highway. Other responsibilities include management of environmental clearances for all projects, the intelligent transportation system program, and various highway safety initiatives. The total organization is nearly 10,000 employees.

Mr. Ryan is a career employee who joined the old Department of Highways in 1968. During his tenure, he has served as Chief Engineer for 3 years, District Engineer for 3 years, Director of Maintenance for 5 years and has held various management and supervisory positions in construction, traffic engineering and maintenance.

Mr. Ryan received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Pennsylvania in 1968 and a Master of Science Degree in Civil Engineering from Bucknell University in 1976.

Mr. Ryan is a native Pennsylvanian, born and raised in Lock Haven. He currently resides in Mechanicsburg with his wife, Bonnie. They have two grown sons, Michael and Christopher. ☺

1. Amount:

There will be four (4) scholarships in the amount of \$1,500.00 each.

2. Due Date

Applications must be postmarked by March 27, 2002 to be considered for a scholarship.

3. Eligibility:

- a. Must be a citizen of the United States or have permanent resident status.
- b. Must be enrolled in, on planning to enroll in, a four-year college program leading to a Bachelor's degree in engineering, preferably civil engineering.
- c. May receive a scholarship only one time.
- d. Must submit copies of SAT scores and High School or College transcripts.

High School Seniors considering an engineering career will be targeted for competition via a mailing to High School Career Guidance Counsels throughout Southcentral Pennsylvania. College students enrolled in a four program leading to a Bachelor's degree in engineering will also be eligible.

Applicants will be evaluated on a point count system with bonus points provided for dependents of an A.S.H.E. member and/or enrollment in a civil engineering major.


