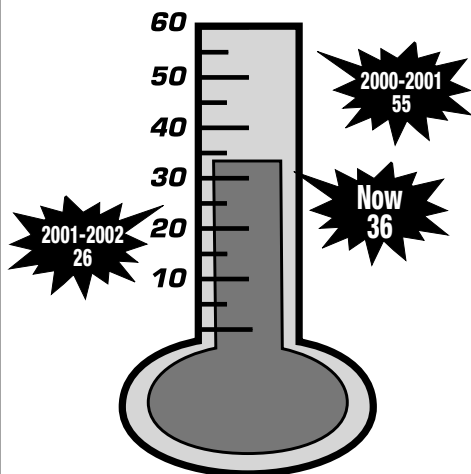

**Central Pennsylvania Engineers Week Council
National Engineers Week 2003
Engineer of the Year**

The Central Pennsylvania Engineers Week Council has named Robert J. Dietz, P.E. recipient of the 2003 Engineer of the Year Award. Mr. Dietz is Executive Vice President and Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors of Gannett Fleming, Inc. an international planning, engineering and construction management firm headquartered in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. The company has more than 1,900 employees in regional offices throughout the United States and Canada. He currently serves as Chairman or President of eight subsidiary corporations.

Since 1966, Mr. Dietz has been actively involved with the planning and design of urban transit, rail, intercity rail, new technology automated guideway, and high speed ground transportation systems. His specific project experience began with assignments on the PATCO Lindenwold Line, the first highly automated rail transit service in the U.S. He subsequently served as Project Manager for preliminary engineering of the \$900 million Detroit Light Rail Program, Project Director for Gannett Fleming's role as Design Manager of the Detroit Downtown People Mover and Project Principal for the Pennsylvania High Speed Ground Transportation Study. More recently, Mr. Dietz served as Project Manager of the Portland-to-Seattle-to-Vancouver Rail Passenger Study and Principal-In-Charge of the \$300 million Bird Island Flats Tunnel and Toll Plaza for Boston's Third Harbor Crossing. In 2002, he served as Principal-In-Charge of the Regional Rail studies for the Harrisburg area known as "CORRIDORone" sponsored by Capital Area Transit.

Mr. Dietz received a Bachelor of Arts in Applied Science from Lehigh University in 1965 and a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering in 1966. He is a registered Professional Engineer in eleven states and is a member of the National Society of Professional Engineers, American Society of Civil Engineers, and Institute of Transportation Engineers. His industry affiliations include the High Speed Ground Transportation Association (HSGTA), the American Road and Transportation Builders Association (ARTBA), and the American Public Transportation Association (APTA). He is a Past Chairman of HSGTA and continues to serve as a Board Member. He also served on the APTA Committee that prepared APTA's Rapid Transit Design Guidelines, and currently belongs to the Light Rail and Legislative Affairs Committees.

Mr. Dietz is married, has three children and three grandchildren, and resides in Camp Hill, Pennsylvania with his wife, Ellen. He is active in community affairs and is a Past Chair of the Harrisburg Regional Chamber and of the Holy Spirit (Hospital) Corporation. He is currently a Director of the Holy Spirit Hospital Board and Chair of the Facilities and Standards Committee. Mr. Dietz is a member of the Board of Pennsylvania State Bank. He is also a member of the Envision Capital Region Steering Committee and an Ambassador with Team Pennsylvania. Previously he has served as Chairman of Leadership-Harrisburg Area, the Trinity High School Development Board, and the Trinity Action Council for Teens. In addition to his family, Mr. Dietz enjoys outdoor activities including gardening, skiing, golf, and tennis.

Shawn D. Good, P.E., L.C. has been named recipient of the 2003 Young Engineer of the Year Award by the Central Pennsylvania Engineers Week Council. Mr. Good is an Architectural Engineer specializing in lighting design and control systems. As the Lighting Department Manager at Brinjac Engineering in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, he is responsible for the oversight of all specialized lighting design applications, custom fixture designs, and the creative integration of these systems into the overall architectural fabric. He is also responsible for the department's fiscal planning and marketing, as well as project and client management.

Mr. Good received his Bachelor of Science degree in Architectural Engineering in 1997 from the Pennsylvania State University. He is a registered Mechanical Engineer (PE) in Pennsylvania, and a Certified Lighting Consultant (LC) by the National Council on Qualification for the Lighting Professions.

As a result of his creative design solutions, Mr. Good has received eight sectional and four regional awards of merit in the International Illumination Design Awards program. His work at Brinjac Engineering has also received two Diamond Awards for Engineering Excellence from the Consulting Engineering Council of Pennsylvania. In the past year, projects that Mr. Good was involved in have been featured in Architectural Lighting magazine and Lighting Design and Application Magazine (the official publication of the Illuminating Engineering Society). He has also had articles published in Consulting Specifying Engineer Magazine and American School and University Magazine.

As an active member of the Illuminating Engineering Society, Mr. Good serves as the Education Co-Chair, volunteering his time to teach various courses to advance and improve the lighting industry in central Pennsylvania. In addition, Mr. Good is an adjunct faculty member at The Bradley Academy for the Visual Arts teaching in the interior design department. He is frequently involved in speaking at regional trade shows such as Philadelphia Lights and the Restoration and Renovation Conference. In addition, he volunteers his time to discuss the architectural engineering profession with high school students.

A few of Mr. Good's recent projects have included: The Pennsylvania State Capital, Keystone Building, National Civil War Museum, Philadelphia Airport Terminal F, Pittsburgh University Convocation Center, Fredrickson Outpatient Surgery Center, Cleve J. Fredrickson Library, Cantone's Restaurant, WITF television studios, Hershey Chocolate World 3D Theater, Milton Hershey School, and multiple projects for the City of Harrisburg. The largest project Mr. Good is currently in charge of is the streetscape redesign for the entire central business district of Harrisburg.

Training Course Announcement
Design and Cost Analyses of Concrete Pavements

The American Concrete Pavement Association, Northeast Chapter, in cooperation with the American Society of Highway Engineers, Harrisburg Section, is hosting a one-day course on ***Design and Cost Analyses of Concrete Pavements***.

The purpose of this course is to provide participants with an overview of basic concrete pavement design concepts using the current AASHTO design procedures, discussion on various life-cycle cost analysis approaches, including those approved by PennDOT, and discussions on costs of various components of concrete pavement systems. Participants who bring along a laptop will be furnished software as well as other documents for more efficiently designing concrete pavements.

The session is scheduled for April 2, 2003 at the Hershey Lodge & Convention Center, Monarch Suite H. The class will start at 8:30 am and will conclude at 4:30 pm. The Pennsylvania Partnership for Highway Quality Conference will take place at the Hershey Lodge on April 3 & 4, 2003.

The cost of this course is discounted for employees of ACPA-Northeast Chapter members, for members of any ASHE Section, as well as for government employees. 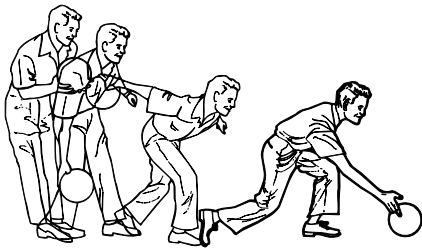

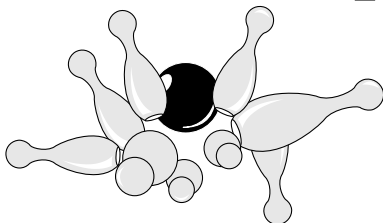
